Background

In FY22/23, the ELC Broward launched the Ad Hoc Fundraising committee and developed the role of the committee/committee members, fundraising parameters and goals.

In FY23/24, the Ad-Hoc Fundraising committee provided feedback and guidance for year 1 of the Coalition's plan to fundraise and friend raise. Committee members committed to assist with recruiting Honorary Board members and connect the organization to potential "friends" and/or donors. ELC staff hosted their first-ever (and successful) fundraising event and developed strategies to generate more unrestricted and program income. As you can see in the below charts, the ELC secured an approximate total of \$30,000.

In the first quarter of FY 24/25 ELC staff explored having a Bingo or Casino night fundraiser, a much bigger event than the Coalition's first event in FY 23/24. However, after careful consideration, including increased strictness and scrutiny from the State related to raising money outside of DEL's allocation and insufficient seed money available to cover the cost to plan and execute a successful fundraising event, all efforts were put on hold.

ELC staff continued to brainstorm and get advisement on alternate ways to continue to increase the amount outside program and unrestricted funding.

Current Status:

At the September 22nd Ad Hoc Fundraising meeting, ELC staff will share the following items for discussion:

- 1. FY 24/25 ELC Income Raised
- 2. FY 25/26 Fundraising Plan

1. FY 24/25 Program Income and Unrestricted Funds Raised Through Fundraising

Staff raised nearly \$119,000 in Program and other Income was raised in FY 24/25. These funds were used towards ELC events including A Day in K (indergarten), State of Childcare, Broward Early Childhood Education (BECE) Conference, and food for provider trainings. Below is a breakdown.

2. ELC Broward's FY 25/26 Fundraising Plan: the plan below was created in order for ELC to bring in additional funding to the organization, outside of DEL and local match funding to enhance or fund ELC programs, initiatives, special events, professional development, and overall strengthens the ELC organization, staff, and board.

Desired Outcomes for 9/22/25 Meeting:

- o Review FY 25/26 Fundraising Plan
- Develop 2-3 Fundraising/Friend raising Goals for FY 25/26
- o Establish Committee members' assignments (and suggested assignments for the full board)
- o Agree on required number of meetings

• FY 25/26 Areas of Focus:

Find/Apply to appropriate grant opportunities to sustain or expand programming

- Secure funding from Private Businesses and Foundations (ELC Sponsors and/or additional seed money to expand fundraising efforts):
 - Target companies or foundations who want more exposure and/or have an interest that aligns with ELC's mission/vision, services, etc.
 - Target large companies that have a department that supports/funds non-profits (most large companies do)
 - Begin campaign to solicit ELC vendors (annual or bi-annual effort)
- o Explore alternative ways to bring in additional funding:
 - Charge Entrance Fee for ELC's State of Child Care (exploring this as an allowable option)
 - Plan 1-2 small no cost events like:
 - Get togethers at a local bar (example: happy hour) and proceeds goes to ELC
 - Group Raise: Organize an "ELC day" at a local restaurant (example: Krispy Kreme) where a portion of the day's proceeds goes to the ELC.
 - ELC Staff Swag "Store" to generate low level of unrestricted funds for the ELC staff fund
 - Board member contribution campaign (annually)

ELC Staff Actions:

- o Update/Freshen Up ELC's Donor Elevator Pitch
 - Update/Develop messaging and collateral materials for Private Businesses, Foundations, and individual donors geared towards early learning as a workforce support for their employees, the impact it has on economic mobility, and of course to help children learn and succeed
- Update the menu of ELC initiatives/programming/events that require or need additional funding (Bootcamp, A Day in K, etc.)

• Board Actions:

- Identify which committee (and board) members can assist with the FY 25/26 Fundraising Plan
- Invite friends, family, colleagues, etc. to ELC fundraising events or invite to donate
