FOOD FOR THOUGHT: HOW TO HAVE GREAT CONVERSATIONS WITH YOUR CHILD AT THE DINNER TABLE

Conversations at the dinner table are important for future success and can boost your child's self esteem, enhance their logical reasoning and improve their ability to analyze.

- Be present: give him/her your full attention. This gives the impression that you're interested and as a result, your child feels valued. This helps create confidence, and it's a precursor for developing appropriate social skills.
- Act like a sports announcer: state everything you or your child is doing while you're doing it! This creates opportunities for vocabulary development.
- Have normal conversation with your child (2-4 exchanges on topic). Talk about experiences you've had, experiences you're having together, things that you see in the world around you, favorite things, or favorite parts of stories...anything goes! Back and forth dialogue is critical for developing language, social skills and building confidence.

Thanksgiving is coming, so allow your child's help with the prep! Whether they help you set the table, wash vegetables, mash the potatoes or mix the dessert batter, it's important you talk with your child and enjoy this time together! Remember to give them compliments on the great job they are doing. Enjoy!
